Veterans Office (8:30am)	Lee Swartz- Veterans. Lee came in to ask that Flag Park be changed to Sandusky County Veterans Memorial Park to fit the Veterans Memorial that has been placed there within the last 12 years. They would like to construct a new entrance that faces Park Avenue to include two stoned columns and an arch depicting the name. Commissioner Zimmerman brought up there are several other organizations they feel we should ask about the change. Commissioners are not opposed to changing the name they just believe it is important to speak with all organizations. The Commissioners will instruct Admin. Garcia to put together a letter outlining what is being proposed to those organizations originally involved in naming Flag Park. She is to also include a copy of the planned archway. Lee also shared that they would like to do a bronze statue of a female and male at the front of the archway. They ask that the metal plaque be moved so the memorial is more visible. Lynn Walby would like to offer service and children from Vanguard school to assist in the construction of the pillars.
