



Scheduled/Completed Trainings

Multiple webinars through the ASPCA and the HSUS are being worked on by kennel staff monthly. Kelly and Evelyn have been completing at least one training per month with Ohio Animal Welfare Federation. Kelly has been completing trainings with the Bissell Pet Foundation and NACA. Pam will be completing Evidence Record Training as she will be our Evidence Officer.

To Discuss

Adoptions have decreased significantly. This is the current trend across the country. We have a couple round tables coming up where we will discuss this and see what other shelters across the country are doing to combat this.

Dog Warden laws changed on March 20th. I went through trainings and I am still adjusting the forms we use. Most of the changes are about Dangerous Dogs and how they become deemed, their restrictions once deemed and the consequences if the rules are not followed when owning one. This may lead to other changes inside the kennel, but I am waiting and watching. (Focusing on what changes will need to take place.)

- FDA intends to update www.fda.gov/authorizedecigs (<http://www.fda.gov/authorizedecigs>) with new products the day of an e-cigarette authorization. This is the first place any new authorized e-cigarettes will be listed.
- FDA's [Searchable Tobacco Products Database](https://www.accessdata.fda.gov/scripts/searchtobacco/) (<https://www.accessdata.fda.gov/scripts/searchtobacco/>) is the most comprehensive listing of tobacco products that can be legally sold. FDA intends to add newly authorized e-cigarettes the day after an authorization.
- The [downloadable flyer version](https://digitalmedia.hhs.gov/tobacco/print_materials/CTP-250?locale=en) (https://digitalmedia.hhs.gov/tobacco/print_materials/CTP-250?locale=en) of the authorized e-cigarettes list will be updated as expediently as possible, typically within 1-2 business days.

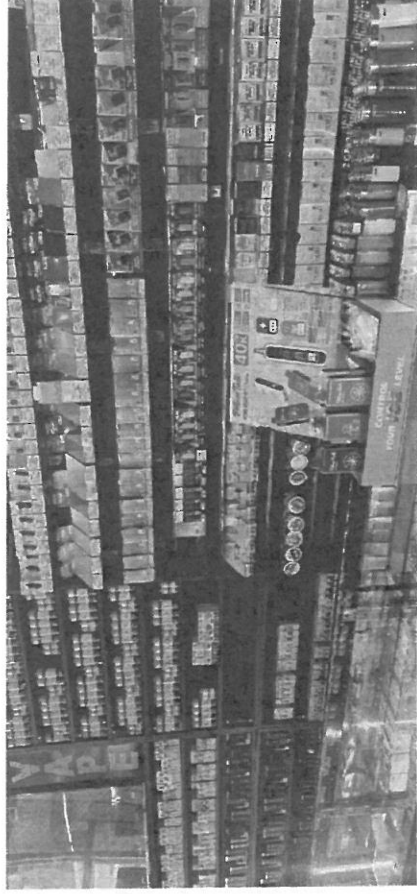
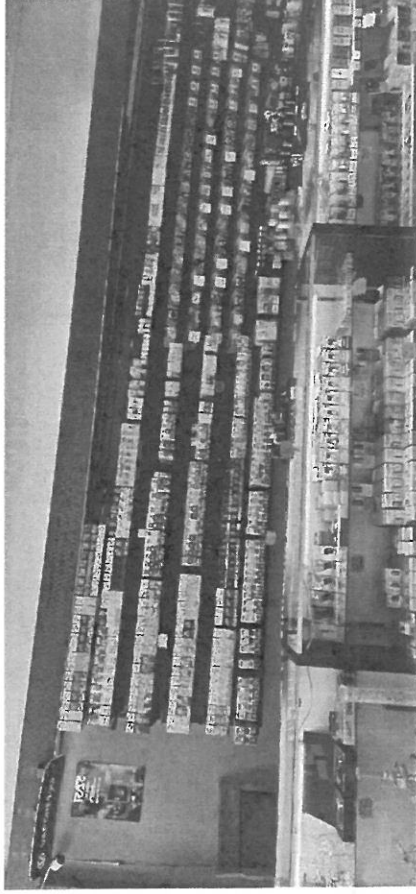
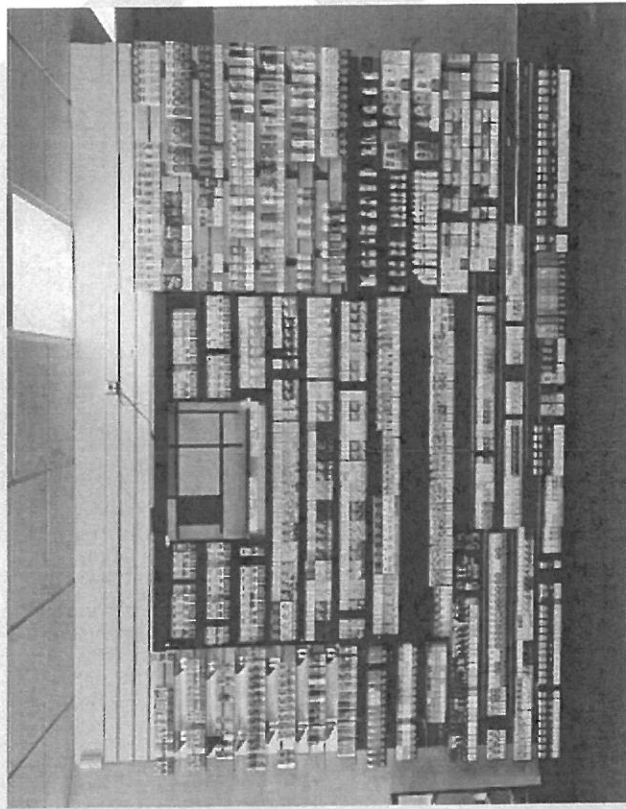


Vape Shops
