## 9/11 REMEMBERANCE CEREMONY



Commissioner Scott Miller, along with Sheriff Chris Hilton, EMS Chief-Jeff Jackson, Ohio State Representative-Gary Click, Lieutenant Governor-Jim Tressel and many others attended the Remembrance Ceremony at the Public Safety Service Memorial in Williams Park, Gibsonburg, to remember the attack, its victims and its hero's on Thursday, September 11th.

A 7,000-pound piece of steel recovered from the 9/11 terrorist attack was at the center of the 9/11 Remembrance Ceremony. The piece came from the antenna of the North World Trade Center in New York City. The memorial was dedicated on September 11, 2016, as a tribute to the nation's first responders and the victims of September 11th.

The event began with the singing of the national anthem and recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance. Prayer was let by Rev. Dr. Matthew Zuehlke, of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in Gibsonburg. Speakers included Gibsonburg Mayor-Steven Fought; Ohio State Representative-Gary Click, Gibsonburg Schools Superintendent-Dr. Robert Falkenstein, Retired Fremont Assistant Chief of Police-Dennis VanWey and Commissioner Scott Miller.

Wreaths were laid by members of the Gibsonburg Madison Township Fire Department, Chief Marty Brown, Gibsonburg Police Department Chief-Don Karr and Sandusky County Sheriff-Chris Hilton, along with Sandusky County EMS Chief-Jeff Jackson.

The event concluded with the playing of "Amazing Grace" by the Black Swamp Pipes and Drums and the singing of "God Bless America", led by the Gibsonburg High School

## CRIBS FOR KIDS

October is Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) Awareness Month in Ohio. SIDS and accidental suffocation are among the leading causes of death in infants between 1 month and 12 months of age, most commonly occurring among infants 1-4 months old.

Sleep-related infant deaths are among the most preventable infant deaths by practicing the ABC's of Safe Sleep. Sandusky County Public Health has been committed to promoting optimal health and safety for all Sandusky County infants and to reducing infant mortality by offering a Newborn Welcome Home Visit to all new mothers.

A home visit is provided at no charge to offer a health check for baby and mom, tips for newborn care, safe sleep education as well as referrals to community resources.

A free Pack-n-Play is offered through the Cribs for Kids program for those in need of a safe place for their infant to sleep. For more information on the Newborn Welcome Home Program and the Cribs for Kids Program, call 419-334-6377.


