TREATMENT ALTERNATIVES FOR SAFER COMMUNITIES

Treatment Alternative for Safer Communities (T.A.S.C.) is advancing its drug capabilities by incorporating new screening options for substances not typically included in standard drug tests. This includes testing for psilocybin mushrooms and LSD (also known as acid), addressing the growing need for more comprehensive substance direction.

Director, Tori Boyer emphasized the importance of staying ahead of emerging trends, stating, "As a drug and alcohol treatment program, we need to evolve with the times and stay on top of trends in our area."

By implementing these enhanced testing methods, T.A.S.C. is setting higher standards for its office and the various programs and entities it serves.

Committed to providing top-tier services, T.A.S.C. continues to support individuals and organizations throughout Sandusky, Seneca, Ottawa, and Huron counties with reliable and comprehensive drug testing solutions.

Throughout her life, Kay held many positions and her commitment to her community is second to none. She once said "It takes a team to get everything done." Many of these teams relied on her leadership and dedication, and the world is a better place for having her in it.

She was a nurse for multiple local physicians, Director of Physician Services with Memorial Health System, CEO & President with Sandusky County Chamber of Commerce, Director of Memorial Hospital Foundation, and Executive Director of Sandusky County Economic Development Corporation. She also served as Ball-ville Township Trustee and Sandusky County Commissioner. She served on the board at Terra State Community College Governing Board for 13 years (including 5 years as chairperson) and was recently named Trustee Emeritus.

Kay was a founding member of "Relay fo Life" of Sandusky County, a longtime member of the Fremont Ohio Soroptimist Chapter, a member of Rotary of Fremont (past President), an Officer for the Rotary Fremont Foundation Board, a longtime Rotary International "Paul Harris" Fellow, past Co-Chair (with her husband Dale) for The United Way of Sandusky County Annual Campaign, a co-founder of the Sandusky County TRIPS program, an organizer of Sacred Heart Parish Annual Church Festivals, and a founding member of Sandusky County Positive People.

She volunteered for many community fundraisers (including Terra State Community College and ProMedica "Cookin' Men" event) and delivered gifts for The United Way Community Christmas Program. She also served as a Eucharistic Minister at Sacred Heart Parish and as a pastoral appointment on the Governing Board of Bishop Hoffman Schools.

Kay received many awards during her years of dedicated community service, including the International Athena "Women of Distinction" Award, the Chamber of Commerce of Sandusky County's REACH "Crystal Apple" Award, ProMedica Memorial Hospital Auxiliary "Auxiliarian of the Year", Memorial Hospital Foundation's "Mary Miller Hayes Leadership" Award, Soroptimist International "Women of Distinction" Award, and The NW Ohio Economic Development Association "Ignite" Award.

She will be greatly missed by her family, friends and the many members of the community she served.

BOARD OF ELECTIONS UPDATE



The Board of Elections will be holding their reorganizational meeting on March 5th. The board reorganizes biennially with one member of each political party being nominated by their respective County Central Committee. Sandra Wise from the Democratic party and Justin Smith from the Republican party have been nominated and approved by the Ohio Secretary of State to serve another 2-year term. They will be sworn in, and a new chairperson will be elected for the term. The board is comprised of four board members, a director and deputy director. Each represents the two major political parties, creating a bipartisan office.

The next election will be held on Tuesday, May 6th. There will be one statewide bond issue on the ballot, along with local tax levies for Bellevue City Schools

and Rice Township. The only candidates appearing on the ballot will be a Republican Primary in the City of Bellevue for council at large and a Republican Primary in Fremont's 3rd ward for the 3rd ward council seat. Therefore, voters in those districts will have the choice of either a Republican ballot or an Issues Only ballot. All other ballots within the county will only contain issues.

The deadline to register to vote or update your name/address information is April 7th. Early in-person voting and voting by mail will begin on April 8th.

It was also attended by Ottawa County Coroner's Office investigators. Session covered notification of death to scene clean up.

INGREDIENTS:

3 1/2 cups Rice Chex cereal
3 1/2 cups Honey Nut Cheerios cereal
1 1/2 cups pretzel sticks
16 oz vanilla almond bark
1/2 cup butterscotch chips

DIRECTIONS:

Mix the cereals and pretzel sticks together in a large bowl..

Melt the vanilla almond bark in the microwave in increments of 15 seconds, stirring after each interval, until completely melted.

Pour the melted almond bark over the cereal mixture and toss together until thoroughly combined.

While almond bark is still warm, gently fold in the Easter M&Ms and butterscotch chips.

Transfer Bunny Bait to a baking sheet and let it stand at room temperature to harden, approximately 45 minutes.

Once the almond bark has hardened, break into pieces and transfer to a serving bowl.

Be creative! As long as the quantities are similar, you can add whatever you like (popcorn, peanuts, sprinkles).

POLICY REVIEW

SECTION 5.13 DRUG FREE WORKPLACE POLICY

Under this policy, the employer can require current employees to undergo testing for alcohol or drug use, when there is reasonable suspicion to believe the employee is under the influence of alcohol or drugs while at work.

Under Section 7.c. <u>Misuse of Alcohol</u>: Substance abuse includes both consumption of alcohol while on duty; as well as the act of reporting to duty or working after having consumed sufficient alcohol to constitute a "positive" result of .04 BAC or higher. Legal conviction for public intoxication, driving while under the influence, or other serious alcohol-related convictions shall also be considered "substance abuse".

Under Section E.3. <u>Conviction</u>: Any employee convicted of any Federal or State criminal drug statute must notify the employer of the fact within five (5) calendar days of the conviction.

This policy is intended to assure that no employee with a drinking or drug problem will have his/her job security, or promotional opportunities jeopardized by a request for treatment.

Sandusky County Emergency Medical Service (SCEMS) began delivering emergency paramedic services in 1975 and continues to be the primary Emergency Medical Service provider for more that 60,000 residents and all visitors to Sandusky County Ohio.

SCEMS is operated by the Sandusky County Board of Commissioners as a single countywide 911 emergency service.

SCEMS has a primary response district of over 400 square miles including a portion of the Ohio Turnpike. The county is a mix of rural, suburban, and industrial areas located in and between several cities, the largest of which is Fremont (population 17k). SCEMS responds to approximately seven thousand five hundred (7,500) emergency calls per year and provides standby coverage for a variety of events and incidents.



MAIL PROCESSING INFORMATION

Please be mindful of the items noted below.

- All out-going mail that requires postage, MUST have a sending department identified (use a Post-It note if necessary). All mail is processed through the mail machine by department.
- If there is not a sending department on out-going mail, that piece of mail will be set on the table in front of the inter-office mail slots with a note requesting the department be identified. Postage will be added once sending department has been identified. Please check the table.
- 3. Do not place inter-office mail in the out-going mail bin that requires postage. The inter-office mail slots are in alphabetical order. If you need help, please ask.
- 4. Envelopes that need to be sealed MUST have the flaps up. The machine cannot seal them if they are not up.
- 5. Over stuffed envelopes jam the mail machine. The price is by weight, using a larger envelope will eliminate jamming the machine and the price is the same.
- 6. Ensure pages in the envelop are below the envelope fold line. If they are not, they jam the machine.

We appreciate you following these guidelines which help the mail process flow more efficiently.




March Food Journal Challenge
